



The Nebo Board of Education is a seven-member group of citizens who are elected to four-year terms. The Board members serve the patrons and students of Nebo District during their term. The Board is empowered by the State Constitution with the "general control and supervision" of public education within the Nebo School District boundaries.

Duties include:

- Setting educational policy that guides the maintenance and operation of all the district's schools and programs.
- Setting policies and making decisions affecting the curriculum, employee relations, budget, and school construction.
- Delivering the best education for the greatest number of students while being fiscally responsible.
- Making policies consistent with community standards and customs.
- Acting with legal and ethical responsibility to do what is best for the greatest number of students in Nebo School District.

The measure of our success is how we affect students, individually and collectively.



Your Feedback is Welcome

The Board of Education believes feedback provides valuable insights and encourages public involvement. The Board will listen to patrons' views on school district matters in the regular monthly Board meetings.

- There is time set aside near the beginning of each meeting to listen to patron comments.
- The Utah Open Meeting Law prohibits the Board from taking action on items that do not appear on the agenda. Therefore, the Board will seldom respond during patron comments in the meeting beyond asking clarifying questions; issues are typically referred to the district administrative staff for review and fact finding.
- As follow-up, a patron may expect a response from the staff on behalf of the Board of Education.

- Understand that the public comment is not a debate, an interactive question/answer session, or a dispute resolution forum; but an opportunity for you to express your comments, suggestions, and concerns to the Board for their information and consideration.
