### **Nebo School Board Approves Raise**

The Nebo Board of Education approved a 5% base salary increase for all employee groups for the upcoming school year. This is a significant investment into our most important assets, our employees. With this increase and other salary schedule changes, our beginning teachers will receive an annual compensation of \$42,388 for next year. Additionally, each employee will receive a bonus of up to \$500 this fall based on their FTE.
