# Nebo District Areas of Focus

- Students have access to college courses and an ability to earn their associate's degree upon graduation.
- Nebo School District
  saved parents and
  students over \$9.7 million
  in the 2020-21 school year
  by providing Concurrent
  Enrollment (CE) and
  Advanced Placement (AP)
- classes for college credit.

  Advanced Placement
  (AP) students, in 24 different classes, earned 4,670 college credits.
- Nebo District's Career and Technical Education students passed 3,351 Skill Certification tests and 271 industry credentials.
- Eighty percent of Nebo student graduates took at least one Concurrent Enrollment, Advanced Placement, or MTECH class during their high school experience to help them become college and career ready.

- Nebo students, in approximately 83 different classes, earned 30,268 college credits with a 97.5% pass rate by successfully completing Concurrent Enrollment classes.
- Nebo students' ACT scores exceeded the national and state scores in every category–English, Mathematics, Reading, Science, and Composite.
- Nebo students' test scores continue to increase in mathematics, science, and writing.
- Nebo School District has a graduation rate of 94.2 percent, which is higher than the state average of 88.2 percent.
- Nebo Education Foundation received approximately \$1.2 million in donations to fund projects in schools.
- More than **\$24 million** was awarded in **scholarships** to our graduates this past year.
- Nebo District belongs to the **Utah Valley University/MTECH K-16 Alliance** and is a member of the **Brigham Young University Public School Partnership**.

## College and Career Ready

Every Nebo student can be prepared to **succeed** in college and in workforce training. Students can earn college credit through Advanced Placement (AP) and Concurrent Enrollment (CE) classes.



The **Advanced** Learning Center (ALC) provides early college and career courses for

high school students while students stay involved at their primary school. The ALC offers a wide variety of courses including aviation, computer programming and repair, digital media, audio engineering, video production, medical science, criminal justice, building construction, engineering, robotics, manufacturing, and teacher education. - A Crisis Intervention Team and emergency response plans are in place at every
- Nebo District has strict safe and drug-free school policies.
- Campus supervisors, security cameras, and school resource officers provide additional safety for students and buildings.
- Nebo District filters Internet and email use for student safety.
- The SafeUT Crisis Chat and Tip Line is a statewide service that provides **real-time crisis intervention** to youth through live chat and a confidential tip program – right from the smartphone. All junior high and high school students received training on the app and have been encouraged to put the SafeUT app on their phone. In addition, all schools in Nebo School District have a link to the SafeUT tip line on their school websites.


# Nebo District is Energy Efficient
