Nebo School District Quick Facts

- Nebo District consistently scores above state and national norms on beginning and endof-level assessments.
- Nebo District operates 27 elementary schools, 13 secondary schools, and 5 special program schools.
- Nebo District is the sixth-largest district in Utah.
- Nebo District's 174 buses travel approximately 12,423 miles per day or 2.2 million miles each year.
- Nebo District serves 18,479 meals per day or 3.27 million meals each year.
- Nebo District is the fifth-largest employer in Utah County with approximately 3,600 full- and part-time employees.

Nebo District Areas of Focus

- Students have access to college courses including receiving their associate's degree upon graduation.
- Advanced Placement (AP) students, in 20 different classes, earned 4,769 college credits.
- Nebo students earned approximately 7,000 college credits by successfully completing Concurrent Enrollment classes.
- Nebo District's Career and Technology Education students passed 6,072 Skill Certification tests.
- Nebo students' ACT scores exceeded the national and state scores in every category—English, Mathematics, Reading, Science, and Composite.
- Nebo School District has a graduation rate of 91 percent, which is significantly higher than the state average of 81 percent.
- Nebo Education Foundation received over \$150,000 in donations to fund projects in schools.
- More than \$8.7 million was awarded in scholarships to our graduates this
- Nebo District belongs to the Utah Valley University K-16 Alliance and is a member of the Brigham Young University Public School Partnership.



Fine Arts

Nebo elementary school students are making academic "GAINS" with the help of a staff development program that utilizes arts integration. "Growing Arts in Nebo Schools" (GAINS) is a program designed to provide classroom teachers with gradespecific tools that help them integrate instruction in art, dance, drama, and music into their daily instruction of language arts, mathematics, science, and other curriculum.



The Advanced Learning Center (ALC)



The **ALC** provides **early college** and **career courses** to high school students while students stay involved at their primary school. The **ALC** offers a wide variety of courses for **college credit**, **career readiness** and **industry certification** including

computer programming and repair, digital media and video production, medical science, building construction, and engineering/drafting. Career and Technical Education (CTE)



CTE programs help students explore a variety of careers through course work in Business, Agriculture, Marketing, Information Technology, Health Science, Technology and Engineering, Family and Consumer Science, and Skilled and Technical program areas. College and Career Ready

Every Nebo student can be a *college-* and *career-ready student* prepared to *succeed* in *college* and in *workforce training*. Students can earn *college credit* through *Advanced Placement (AP)* and *Concurrent Enrollment* classes.

Technology

- Our district continues to emphasize technology integration including LCD projectors, document cameras, hand-held devices, and mini labs in classrooms to engage teachers and students in 21st Century teaching and learning.
- Currently, there are 150 wired computer labs that include 5,400 computers, 10 wireless mobile laptop/Netbook labs that include 360 devices, 20 iPad labs with sync carts that include 720 devices, and 65 wireless Chromebook labs that include over 4,000 devices in 40 schools and 5 programs. Students use hundreds of personal technology devices daily.

Nebo District is Committed to Maintaining Safe Schools




- A Crisis Intervention Team is available to every school.
